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### MANDATORY INSTRUMENT AND/OR PROVISIONS ADDRESSING SAFETY STANDARDS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF MORE THAN 12 INDUSTRIAL PERSONNEL ON BOARD VESSELS ENGAGED ON INTERNATIONAL VOYAGES

### Introduction

1 This document is submitted in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 6.12.5 of the Organization and method of work of the Maritime Safety Committee and the Marine Environment Protection Committee and their subsidiary bodies (MSC-MEPC.1/Circ.5/Rev.2) and provides comments on documents SDC 8/2, paragraph 3.3 and SDC 8/4/1.

2 PPR 8 agreed with the modifications to paragraph 8.4 of the draft IP Code related to the carriage of dangerous liquid chemicals in bulk, which had been proposed by ESPH 26 (PPR 8/13, paragraph 3.9). The modifications are contained in annex 7 to document PPR 8/3.

# Discussion

3 In particular, the agreed modifications to paragraph 8.4.1 and its sub-paragraph 8.4.1 of the draft IP Code read as follows:

"8.4.1 In order to meet the functional requirements in paragraph II/9.2, when simultaneously carrying dangerous liquid chemicals, <u>and/or</u> liquefied gases as cargo

in bulk and industrial personnel, the ship shall either be certified in accordance with the requirements of parts B or C of SOLAS chapter VII or meet and be certified in accordance with a standard not inferior to that <u>developed</u> acceptable by the Organization. In addition, the following apply:

.1 carriage of toxic <u>products</u>, low-flashpoint products or acids are not allowed when <u>the total number of carrying more than 60</u> persons on <u>board exceeds 60;</u> ..."

4 Although these modifications allow flexibility in the operation of certain vessels, such as supply vessels, it also means that vessels certified to carry more than 60 persons (which may be a combination of IP and SPS) may carry the dangerous goods only if the actual number of persons on board during any voyage is less than 60. This raises a number of questions, in particular:

- .1 how to record this limitation on the certificates; and
- .2 is a limitation to be included in the certificate for the carriage of dangerous goods stating that it would not be valid on voyages when more than 60 persons are onboard?

5 Also, IACS recalls that the intent of limiting the number of persons on board was to address the concern when considerable quantities of toxic products, low-flashpoint products or acids were carried on chemical tankers or gas carriers.

## Proposals

6 To address the above issues, IACS proposes to revise the wording of sub-paragraph 8.4.1.1 of the draft IP Code as follows<sup>\*</sup>:

"8.4.1 In order to meet the functional requirements in paragraph II/9.2, when simultaneously carrying dangerous liquid chemicals, <u>and/or</u> liquefied gases as cargo in bulk and industrial personnel, the ship shall either be certified in accordance with the requirements of parts B or C of SOLAS chapter VII or meet and be certified in accordance with a standard not inferior to that <u>developed acceptable</u> by the Organization. In addition, the following apply:

.1 carriage of toxic <u>products</u>, low-flashpoint products or acids are not allowed on chemical tankers or gas carriers when <u>the total number</u> <u>of carrying more than 60</u> persons <u>on board exceeds 60</u>;. In these circumstances the Certificate of Fitness is to be annotated to note the limit of 60 persons; ..."

### Actions requested of the Sub-Committee

7 The Sub-Committee is invited to consider the above discussion, the proposal in paragraph 6 and take action as appropriate.
